International Meeting in Washington D.C. and NCSEA Annual Conference in Baltimore

The international community of child support and family maintenance law continues to grow together. Subsequent to the Heidelberg Conference, NCSEA held its Annual Conference "Charting A Course For The Modern Family" with a broad international track from 4-7th August 2013 in Baltimore.



Previously, the experts and officials from around the world were received by Vicki Turetsky at the Office of Child Support Enforcement (OCSE) in Washington DC on the 2nd August 2013 and presented a full day program with information about the child support system in the US as well as the latest political developments, in particular the state of ratification of the Hague Convention 2007.



At the NCSEA Annual Conference 2013, the "Internationals" could not only listen to exciting presentations and maintain informal exchange, they also spent a whole day with Hannah Roots and Chris Beresford at an International Round Table where they discussed the changes in the participating countries and, in particular, the development and perpetuation of a global child support network. DIJuF and NCSEA will consolidate their cooperation and provide a platform for networking.



Philippe Lortie, Permanent Bureau of the Hague Conference, was able to announce the ratification of the Hague Maintenance Convention by Ukraine and to report about a conference for Latin America in December, which is hosted by the Heidelberg Center for Latin America, the Hague Conference and DIJuF and aims at promoting the ratification of the Hague Convention 2007 in Latin America.
